EDITORIAL Freebie culture

The prevalence of a culture centered around freebies is on the rise in today's political landscape. From an economic standpoint, this trend poses a significant financial burden on our nation. Economists and sociologists have long expressed concerns about this phenomenon, echoed even by the Supreme Court, which has criticized the freebie culture. However, political parties seem reluctant to acknowledge their collective responsibility in perpetuating it. Regrettably, amidst all this, the voice of the common man, who desires not handouts but rather a better quality of life, often goes unheard.

The common man seeks relief from inflation and increased employment opportunities, particularly for the youth. Their aspirations revolve around securing a job commensurate with their education and qualifications, eradication of corruption, and ensuring that no one suffers from hunger. Despite recent pledges to enhance schemes like MNREGA, which aims to provide employment to the unemployed, questions linger about its efficacy and the absence of specific targets.

In the latest announcements, every electoral party's agenda contains promises of giving Rs 1,000 to Rs 1,500 per month to women. There is free ration, free electricity and even free medical treatment, but economists say that such extravagant announcements take the state beyond the limits of its total revenue. To fulfill their promises or guarantees they have to repay loans. On every loan, interest has to be paid and the principal also has to be returned. The free electricity scheme takes a heavy toll on the electricity generation and distribution system. States are burdened with excessive debt. The 13th Finance Commission had warned three states about getting trapped in the debt trap. They were instructed to carry

out financial reforms to come

out of this trap. These states were Kerala, Punjab and West Bengal. The condition of Punjab is such that it has to knock on the doors of the Supreme Court to get Rs. 6 thousand crores of its Rural Development Fund from the Centre. Punjab has a debt of Rs 3,23,135 crore. Instead of decreasing in the next year, it will become Rs 3,53,600 crore. In fact, the schemes of free electricity, free bus travel and other concessions are having a heavy toll on the economy of the states. However, the main revenue of state governments is spent on paying salaries, pensions and interest.

More and more loans are raised to fulfill populist announcements for the public. This policy has to be changed. First, every state should understand that the loan it is taking from the Center or the Reserve Bank, it has to repay ultimately. Not only the principal amount but also the interest. There will be no concession in this. The web of debt is a mess for every country and every state. Measures to deal with it should also be on the level of production and investment.

The Center and the top judiciary have given free electricity and States that provide other free facilities have been warned of falling into the trap of debt. In fact, populist announcements do not result in additional production or investment, nor do they result in additional growth in the country's GDP or employ-ment. Yes, that much. Of course, the debt burden on the states increases, which ultimately ties their hands because they have to repay the loans. Overall, this Revdi culture is going to prove costly for the country. Therefore, political parties should also show sources of revenue increase in their manifesto, but such alternative economic programs are not visible in the political manifesto of any party.

For the triangular contest, Congress rebels become BSP's choice

BSP is relying on Congress rebels this time to regain its lost voter base in Chambal. Instead of relying on its own party cadre, Mayawati has given tickets to those disgruntled Congress lead-ers in Gwalior and Morena who felt it appropriate to ride the elephant when their aspirations for tickets in Congress were not fulfilled. It is hoped that BSP candidates in both Gwalior and Morena constituencies will benefit from caste equations. It is believed in Gwalior's political circles that the Gujjar community might be displeased with Congress due to Ramsevak Babuji not getting a ticket. Last time, as a Congress candidate, Maharaj lost this seat by more than one lakh votes. It was the first electoral defeat for the Scindia family in the last forty years. New equations in Bhind due to Devashish's entry



Researchers need 'open' bibliographic databases, new declaration says

When universities are deciding whom to hire and promote, or grant organiza-tions are selecting projects to fund, there's a good chance they're referencing more than just the application materials. Many organizations rely on databases that compile publication information including authors, affiliations, citations, and funding sources to create metrics meant to quantify a researcher's productivity and the qual ity of their work.




Some of the best known databases, such as the Web of Science and Scopus, are proprietary and offer pay-to-access data and services supporting these and other metrics, including university rankings and journal impact factors. But in a declaration posted today, more than 30 research and funding organizations call for the community to commit to platforms that instead are free for all, more transparent about their methods, and without restrictions about how the data can be used. "At a time when decision making in science is increasingly guided by indicators and analytics, addressing the problems of closed research information must be a top priority," states the Barcelona Declaration on Open Research Information. Signatories so far include funders such as the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and the French National Research Agency, as well as more than a dozen academic institutions.

Maoists should try to effect change through ballot box

in the dense forests of Chhattisgarh, at least 29 Naxals were neutralized, including the top leaders, Shankar Rao and Lalita, divisional committee members of the CPI (Maoist)'s North Bastar Division. This clash, occurring just days before the Lok Sabha polls in Bastar, signifies the ongoing battle against insurgency in the region. More than 60,000 security personnel have been deployed in the district to oversee the electoral process. This is the highest casualty suf-fered by the Maoists in a single incident since 2018, when 37 of them were killed in Maharashtra's Gadchiroli district.

The Maoist rebels may have had reasons to hold a grudge against the government, but their romantic notion of revolution is totally misplaced, because they'll never succeed in displacing the government, or creating their own Communist paradise in Bastar, or any other region of the country.

So yes, they'll probably try to continue their usual attacks, but with the continued, concerted push by the security forces into their strongholds, those attacks will become fewer and far between.
