Mobile lifter arrested

Bhilai, (CNS): Police have arrested a ruffian on charges of mobile lifting. The accused was absconding since last three months. Anjora Chowki in-charge informed that the accused is identified as Manish Sahu (20) son of Narayan Prasad Sahu a resident of Saraswati Nagar Durg. Police have recovered the stolen mobile phone from his possession. A complaint in this regard was lodged by Tej Prakash Sahu (28) son of Ubhay Ram Sahu a resident of Anjora. The victim had kept the mobile phone on the seat of his bike when the accused burgled the phone worth Rs 16000. The accused was produced before the court and has been sent to jail on judicial remand.

INTUC demands Rs 20 lakh compensation

Raipur, (CNS): INTUC State Secretary Bhavani Markam informed that a team was constituted to probe the mishap which took place on September 1. 8:30 am Venkateshwar Ispat Urla here. The blast which took place injured three workers -Bhagwati Sahu of Gudhiyari, Rajendra Chauhan of Birgaon and Jay Narayan Pandey. All the three were admitted at Kalda Nuring Home and while undergoing treatment Bhagwati Sahu and one more worker succumbed to the injuries. The team while conducting probe came across gross negligence in safety parameters inside the plant, old machineries and discrepancies in provident fund too. INTUC has demanded Rs 20 lakh compensation for the family member of deceased workers or else INTUC will stage demonstration in front of office gate.

Youth murdered in broad daylight

Bhilai, (CNS): A 25-year-old youth was murdered in broad daylight near Puja Pandal in Sector 9. He was allegedly stabbed to death by his friends. The accused are at large and police have launched intensive search operations for trapping the accused. Police informed that the deceased was Kailash Gupta alias Raja (25) a resident of Model Town. The reason behind this crime is unknown. According to information, the victim was roaming with his friends for the entire day on Monday. Near Ganesh Puja Pandal in Sector 9, they quarreled over some issue. The quarrel grew violent and Kailash Gupta was stabbed to death by his friends. The accused left him bleeding on the road and escaped from the spot. Locals immediately informed Police after which the victim to JLN Hospital where he was pronounced brought dead. Police have lodged a case and search operations have been launched to trap the absconding accused.

Stolen booty recovered from Uttar Pradesh

Bhilai, (CNS): Police have recovered stolen booty worth Rs 2.25 lakhs from a person in Uttar Pradesh. Three accused of serial thefts were arrested few days ago. They had kept the stolen booty at their friend's place in Uttar Pradesh. Durg Police visited Uttar Pradesh and arrested the person who had kept the stolen booty. ASP (City) Rohit Jha informed that few days ago they had arrested three accused identified as Girijesh Singh alias Mantu (39) son of Surendra Nath Singh a resident of District Chandaury (UP); Ravishankar Mourya (26) son of Hemraj Mourya a resident of PS Phulpur (Varanasi); and Shyamali (29) wife of Girijesh Singh a resident of Chandaury (UP). With the arrest of this notorious thief couple and their accomplice, police had solved five cases of thefts which occurred in the city in the last few months. Posing as a well off family, the accused were residing in a rented house in Subhash Nagar, Durg. During interrogation, they had confessed to have committed five thefts in Durg city.

Economic situation not frightening as projected: Gehlot

Union minister for Social Justice and Empowerment Thawarchand Gehlot on Monday claimed that the economic situation in the country was not as "frightening" as being projected.

He also stated that the people whose citizenship remains unproven in Assam might have "to go to where they have come from", amid growing concerns

over the number of exclusions from the final NRC list.

The Social Justice and Empowerment Minister made these comments at a press conference to mark completion of 100 days of the Narendra Modi government in its second term.

On the state of economy, the minister said, "In some sectors, like auto, there are reports (of slowdown) but the Union

government has clarified there is no economic slowdown. It is evident from statistics of sale and purchase made public by the Centre that there is no such atmosphere of slowdown as is being projected".

As per data, the country's GDP growth, which was at an average of 7.7 per cent during 2014-18, contracted to 5 per cent in the first quarter of the current financial year, the lowest in the last six years. For its part, the Centre has been assuring that the fundamentals of the economy are strong and that the slowdown is cyclical and temporary in nature.

"The situation is not that frightening. The Centre has taken some financial measures, like the merger of banks and reduction in interest rates, in view of this," he said.

Speaking on jobs data, the minister said the Centre did not have exact figures of unemployment but claimed it had worked to create job opportunities for several crore people.

He said over 17 crore people were provided loans under the PM's MUDRA scheme.

Shri Guru Singh Sabha announces first 'Free School'

Shri Guru Singh Sabha announced the first 'Free School', where people can learn Punjabi and Gurumukhi, and even become qualified 'Granthi', i.e. priest. The school has been named Bhai Gurudas Gurmat Vidyalaya.

The classes under the school would be organised in the campus of Guru Harkrishan Public School (GHPS). "Primarily, we will be starting the classes in the evening from 4 pm to 7 pm, and further, more optional slots would be provided as per student strength," Devendra Singh Gandhi, coordinator said. He added that the training and study is open for all the age groups. "From a school student to a senior, everyone can learn the language and even learn the lessons shared by Guru Nanak

during the course," Gandhi said.

The students registering themselves can also become a certified priest of Gurudwara, i.e. 'Granthi' after completing the required lessons. "There has been a lot of demand for such a school in the community and followers from other communities as well, because it is difficult for anyone to learn the language and understand the lessons in the busy household environments," Gandhi said.

Further, he added that Nanak's teachings are not limited for a specific group or community. "Since many do not know the language, it becomes a limitation for them to learn the lessons taught by Guru Nanak, so this will be a step in giving them the opportunity to learn to live happily through the words of Nanak," Gandhi said.

Criteria adopted for Delimitation of Wards is wrong: BJP

Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Monday alleged that the criteria adopted by the ruling Congress Government on delimitation of Municipal Wards is wrong whereas the party would also oppose the government move if the upcoming Civic Bodies elections are being conducted on ballot papers instead of Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs).

Convener of the BJP's Civil Body elections Amar Agrawal said that they are keeping a close watch on the alleged conspiracy of Congress government over the process to conduct the upcoming civic bodies elections later this year. He made the above statement while addressing the senior office-bearers of the party during the meeting to discuss the preparations for the upcoming civic bodies elections.

Earlier, the Leader of Opposition in Chhattisgarh Legislative Assembly Dharmraj Kaushik and former



Chief Minister Dr Raman Singh gave essential instructions to the party rank and file.

Speaking on the occasion, the State BJP President Vikram Usendi asked the party leaders to gear up for the upcoming elections as it would be crucial for the party.

Public Contact Campaign Chief Bhupinder Sawanni said that participation of party workers is essen-

tial during the month-long Public Contact programme for the upcoming elections.

BJP General Secretary Girdhar Gupta said that Service Week would be organized from September 14 to 20 on the occasion of Birthday of Prime Minister Narendra Modi during which the public-welfare schemes of Centre would be taken up to the people.

Murder accused arrested from Hospital

Police have arrested a youth on charges of murder. The accused had stabbed a girl to death and had tried to commit suicide. The accused was recuperating at Medical College Hospital in Raipur. After his discharge from the hospital, Police took him in custody. During interrogation, he confessed to have committed the crime. The accused was produced before the court and has been sent to jail on judicial remand. The accused is identified as Rupesh Chankradhari of Utai.

It needs to be mentioned here that in a shocking incident, a youth had killed a girl and then attempted suicide at the girl's residence in Bajrang Nagar, Azad Square, Utai in the month of August. The girl had died on the spot while the boy was admitted in serious condition at Medical College Hospital in Raipur. This incident was an outcome of some dispute in love affair.

The deceased girl was identified as Geetanjali, daughter of Roman Lal Sahu a resident of Bajrang Nagar, Utai. The injured boy is identified as Rupesh Chankradhari, a resident of Utai. Rupesh had allegedly stabbed Geetanjali to death and thereafter attempted suicide with the same knife.



Police had received complaint from girl's brother Tameshwar Sahu. Tameshwar informed that he reached home from work place on Saturday at around 21:00 hrs. His sister Geetanjali opened the door after which he entered the house. Within few minutes, he found that Rupesh Chankradhari hiding in the kitchen. Tameshwar moved out of the house and immediately informed his father Roman Lal Sahu, who was sitting in the nearby square.

Tameshwar and his father reached home and knocked the door. When Roman asked his daughter Geetanjali to open the

door, she stated that Rupesh has taken her on knife point and is not allowing her to open the door.

Tameshwar informed police on Dial 112 after which Police team reached the spot. Finding no other alternative, the family broke the door to enter the house.

They found that Geetanjali was lying in a pool of blood in the kitchen. Heavily bleeding Rupesh was also lying nearby.

Both the injured were rushed to Utai Government Hospital where the girl was pronounced brought dead. Rupesh was referred to Medical College Hospital, Raipur in serious condition.

Member of International thug arrested by police from Delhi

A Nigerian youth use to cheat the women and girls all over the country and state by posing as elite on social media and contacting people through Facebook. Police arrested him from Delhi and this Nigerian youth is part of some international gang.

The youth chatting through Facebook, used to slowly become friendly with women and used to fall them into his trap by sending them costly shoes, purse, bags, and other such parcels and then use to target them to pay penalty worth lakhs through customs including airport clearance, anti-terroristic certificate and other such taxes.

This youth has so far cheated a woman from Raipur of Rs 5.10 lakh with credit to his different accounts.

The police has also recovered 1 laptop, passport, Visa, Wi-Fi router, cash of Rs 47000 and 05 pieces of foreign Nigerian currency. A woman had filed a com-

plaint against the youth in Civil Lines thana in Raipur.

According to the woman, this youth got friendship with her last in August 2019.

The youth had disclosed his name as Alex Antony and one day he informed that he has got some foreign brand shoes, purse and had sent it through parcel to her.

On the second day, he called up saying that she has to send Rs 50000 for Airport Clearance and sent his account number of her mobile and she deposited the amount the next day.

Again on the next day, the complainant got another phone call asked her to deposit Rs 1.45 lakh for Anti-Terroristic certificate for the amount which is in Pound inside the parcel, as no foreign currency is allowed in India and on getting this amount from parcel it will be refunded to her and in this way he cheated of amount worth Rs 5.10 lakh.
