Muslim's seek strictest punishment NSUI demands strict action for Raisen rape accused

Community stands united against heinous crime



Bhopal: There was intense public outrage in the city against Salman, accused of raping a minor in Gauharganj. On Saturday afternoon, members of the Muslim community gathered at Mata Mandir Square and staged a strong demonstration, symbolically hanging an effigy of the accused to express their anger.

A large number of youth participated in the protest, raising slogans demanding justice. The demonstra-tion was led by Mujahid Siddiqui from the Sajid Friends Club. Addressing the gathering, Siddiqui said, "There is no place in society for a criminal like Salman. We demand the death penalty for him under the Constitution. The entire Muslim community is ashamed of this act, and no lawyer or organization

He emphasized that such crimes are unacceptable in any religion and urged the government and police to ensure the strictest punishment at the earliest. Police remained deployed throughout the protest to

Earlier, Karni Sena state president Indal Singh Rana felicitated Rizwan, who assisted police in nabbing the accused after a brief chase, with a reward of Rs 11,000.

Reiterating the community's stand, Siddiqui said that while they seek the harshest punishment as per Sharia law, as Indian citizens they are demanding the death penalty under the Constitution.

He added that Salman's actions have brought shame to the Muslim community in Bhopal and across the nation. No community leader or lawyer will extend any support to him, he affirmed, stressing their firm demand for capital punishment.

Pharmacy Council chairman, others booked for assaulting youth



Bhopal: Habibganj police have registered an FIR against Pharmacy Council Chairman Sanjay Jain and several others after a video of a young man being assaulted on the council premises in Bhopal went viral. The victim, Tushar Sonare, released an emotional video stating that Jain, KK Yadav, Gopal Yadav and other officials dragged him inside the office, beat him severely, and even struck his private parts. He appealed

to the Chief Minister for action, alleging that a police officer at the scene did nothing to intervene. According to Tushar, he had been visiting the council for a month to get his certificate digitally signed but was re peatedly turned away. On Friday, when he attempted to meet an officer, a guard stopped and pushed him After freeing himself, the guard fell, leading to a con frontation where staff members allegedly attacked him. Tushar said he had recorded his grievances on video due to prolonged delays, which angered officials and triggered the assault.

FIRs filed from both sides

The Pharmacy Council claims Tushar assaulted the guard first, disrupting government work. FIRs have now been filed from both sides. Based on a complaint by Gopal Singh Yadav, Tushar faces charges of ob structing government work and issuing threats. Mean while, Tushar's complaint has led to cases against San-jay Jain, Jitendra, and another unidentified individual for assault and intimidation.

Probe report reveals fear and harassment at VIT



Bhopal: A three-member committee appointed by the Madhya Pradesh Private University Regulatory Commission has submitted its report on the vandalism and arson incident at VIT University in Sehore district. The findings paint a troubling picture of intimidation, mismanagement, and rising fear among students. According to the report, students on campus are under constant

pressure and harassment. Many revealed that they were scared to raise concerns due to the administration's threatening and authoritarian approach. The committee noted that the university management frequently warned students that complaining or speaking out could result in academic penalties, including being marked failed in exams. Several instances were recorded where

students' ID cards were confiscated, they were stopped from appearing in examinations, or given unusually low marks in practicals as a form of punish-

Role of police and administra-tion also questioned: The investigation has also raised serious questions about the role of the police and district administration. Despite being aware of the tense atmosphere on campus, authorities remained passive. Shockingly, the administration claimed it received formal information from the university management only around 2:00 a.m., long after unrest had escalated into vandalism and arson.

The report further highlights students' grievances regarding food quality. Complaints about the mess were routinely dismissed, with students being told to "eat whatever is prepared," reinforcing the climate of neglect.

Around 500 public applications remain pending daily

Municipal Corporation engineers, Patwaris, and Revenue Inspectors have also been deployed for SIR work, delaying services like birth and death certificates.

Daily, around 500 public applications—including caste, income, domicile, and EWS certificates remain pending. Tehsildars and Naib Tehsildars, who typically hear nearly 300 cases a day, have

postponed most hearings until after December 4.

The SIR began on November 4th and initially progressed slowly, prompting a reprimand from the Election Commission.

Since then, administrative staff have accelerated efforts, pushing digitization to 60%. Constituency progress varies: Bhopal North (61.5%), Narela (56%), Bhopal Central (51.6%), Govindpura (50.8%), and Huzur (63%).

Deputy District Election Officer Bhuvan Gupta confirmed that the work will be completed by the December 4th deadline, with the Collector monitoring updates every two hours.

Bhopal: Protests have intensified across Bhopal after controversial remarks made by AJAKS State President and senior IAS officer Santosh Verma regarding Brahmin daughters. On Saturday, hundreds of Gen-Z members, led by Pandit Ashish Sharma, staged a massive demonstration outside Barkatullah University. Sharma said the issue concerns

the dignity of all women in the state and insisted that an FIR be lodged immediately along with Verma's suspension. During the protest, Congress spokesperson Vivek Tripathi criticized the silence of BJP's Brahmin leaders, accusing them of ignoring a grave insult to their community. He said such "indecent mentality" cannot be tolerated in Madhya Pradesh. Tensions escalated: Tensions escalated when protesters placed Verma's effigy on a donkey and beat it. Ashish Sharma warned that if the government does not act Gen-Z will take out a state-wide pro cession with Verma himself seated

Protesters, including Abhishek Dwivedi, said the officer's remarks could incite social unrest and vowed to continue the agitation until action is taken. A large number of youth from upper-caste communities participated, expressing strong anger over the statement.

Rewa MP writes to Union Minister: Meanwhile, Rewa MP Janardan Mishra has written to Union Minister Jitendra Singh, demanding a probe into Verma's remarks, criminal background, and alleged castechange for promotion.
