# India win by 30 runs to seal series 3-1

Ahmedabad (UNI) India sealed the series in emphatic ashion, defeating South Africa in the fifth T20I in Ahmedabad to clinch the contest 3-1. After posting a mammoth 231/5, powered by blazing half-centuries from Tilak Varma and Hardik Pandya, who smashed the second-fastest T20I fifty by an Indian off just 16 balls, the hosts held their nerve under pressure to restrict South Africa to 201/8. South Africa threatened early through Quinton de Kock's attacking fifty, but India clawed their way back. Varun Chakravarthy turned the game on its head with a doublewicket over, while Jasprit Bumrah and Hardik Pandya removed the set batters to derail the chase. With this, India won their eighth consecutive T20I series, which they have not lost since December 2023.

After South Africa won the toss and elected to bowl, the Proteas were immediately under pressure as India's young and aggressive lineup laid the foundation for a mammoth total of 231 for 5 in their 20 overs.

Sanju Samson and Abhishek Sharma provided India with a strong start. Samson played a quick 37 off 22 balls, while Abhishek contributed 34 off 21 deliveries, giving India a solid platform.

Samson's innings featured crisp drives and clever placement, and Abhishek's strokeplay helped maintain a rapid scoring rate early on. However, it



was the Varma-Pandya duo that transformed the innings into an electrifying spectacle.

Tilak Varma, at number three, played a brilliant 73 off 42 balls,

Varma's innings combined audacity with intelligence; he maneuvered the field effortlessly, exploited gaps, and dispatched loose deliveries over the boundary.

Patel also hinted that Stokes' high standards may have influenced the decision. "We all know he doesn't do anything at 80%. Maybe he thought he was a risk, so he didn't bowl," Patel said.
