Bhopal: Bhopal's morning sky came alive today with the flutter of wings as the city hosted its first-ever Bird Festival, a vibrant initiative by the M.P. State Biodiversity Board and the Regional Museum of Natural History. Inaugurated by Principal Chief Conservator of Forests Shubhraman Sen and Member Secretary Ajay Yadav, the festival aimed to bridge the gap between urban citizens and the avian world. Under the theme “Birds Around Us,” the event highlighted that protecting biodiversity is a shared civic responsibility rather than a purely institutional task. The day was packed with engaging activities, including poster competitions, street plays, and a stunning photography exhibition showcasing the diverse species inhabiting Bhopal's wetlands and forests. Expert lectures added depth to the celebration, with Nandkishore Dudhe from the Bombay Natural History Society emphasizing the concept of “Citizen Science”—encouraging residents to identify and document local birds. Students creatively depicted the challenges faced by urban birds, while experts like Dr. Beenish Rafat and Mohammad Khalik guided enthusiasts through the



city's rich natural heritage. This festival has successfully established that Bhopal is not just a city of lakes, but a thriving sanctuary for countless winged stories, urging every resident to become a guardian of nature.
