Two Army porters die after slipping from Gulmarg slopes

Srinagar: Bodies of two civilian porters who slipped from a forward area near the Line of Control in the Gulmarg sector of north Kashmir's Baramulla district were recovered, officials said on Friday. The two porters, identified as Liyakat Ahmad Deedard and Ishfaq Ahmad Khatana — both residents of Chandoosa in Baramulla — had skidded from a forward area into a stream on Thursday afternoon. Soon after the incident, a massive rescue operation was launched in the Gulmarg sector, which falls under the operational control of the Srinagar-based 15 Corps. Searches were also extended to the Poonch sector in the Jammu region, as it lies close to the area where the mishap occurred. The Poonch stretch of the LoC falls under the jurisdiction of the Nagrota-based White Knight (16) Corps of the Army.

Ahlmad of Saket District Court dies by suicide

New Delhi: An Ahlmad (court clerk) of Saket District Court allegedly died by suicide on Friday morning by jumping from the fifth floor of the court building. A senior police official said that the deceased was identified as Harish Singh Mahar, who was 60 percent physically disabled and was posted as an Ahlmad. The police said that a suicide note was recovered from his possession. "I am committing suicide due to office work pressure... I am a 60 per cent handicapped person and this job is very tough for me. I succumbed to the pressure. Ever since I became an Ahlmad, I have been having suicidal thoughts... No one is responsible for my suicide," his note said.

Major Accident in Thane Five Injured

Mumbai: Five people were seriously injured in a major accident on the Thane Ghodbunder Road section of National Highway 48 in Maharashtra on Friday. According to the police, the accident involving collision of many vehicles occurred at around 7.30 am. Multiple vehicles were piled up on NH-48 in Gaimukh Ghat stretch, resulting in extensive damage to more than 20 vehicles and disruption of vehicular movement on the crucial route that connects Mumbai,Thane and Nashik. Regional Disaster Management Cell (RDMC) and the Fire Brigade, rushed to the spot to carry out a rescue operation. The injured were shifted to a nearby hospital for treatment.

Couple dies of suffocation from burning stove

Koderma: A salon operator and his wife died of suffocation while sleeping on Friday by inhaling poisonous gases emitted by a burning coal stove, which they had kept in their room to keep themselves warm amid the cold weather in Jharkhand's Koderma district, police said. The deceased, residents of Puranana-nagar, have been identified as Birendra Sharma (58) and his wife Kanti Devi (52). According to the couple's son Surendra Sharma, all family members had dinner around 11:30 pm on Thursday and retired to their respective rooms. While food is usually cooked on a gas stove in the household, on Thursday night, cooking was done on a coal stove for unspecified reasons.

Modern police fleet to intensify Himachal's war on chitta

Shimla: Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today said that the campaign against 'chitta' and other narcotic substances would be intensified, as he flagged off 18 modern anti-chitta and patrol vehicles of the Himachal Pradesh Police from the State Secretariat here. The newly-inducted fleet comprises 12 anti-chitta vehicles, four anti-human trafficking vehicles and two ambulances for rescue operations. The initiative, according to the Chief Minister, is aimed at strengthening law and order by enhancing the operational capacity of the police force through modern technology and infrastructure. Addressing the occasion, Sukhu said that technology plays a crucial role in curbing drug trafficking and related crimes.

Rahul Gandhi launches broadside against BJP

Calls 'double-engine' govt a "speed of devastation"

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Friday mounted a sweeping attack on the BJP-led governments at the Centre and in states, accusing them of running a system driven by corruption, abuse of power and crony capitalism, and alleging that ordinary citizens are paying the price in the form of injustice, disasters and loss of lives.
In a strongly worded statement posted on platform X, Gandhi said the BJP's much-touted "double-engine" governments had "ruined people's lives across the country" and reduced the suffering of the poor, workers and middle class to mere statistics. "Corruption, abuse of power, and the poison of arrogance have spread from top to bottom in BJP's politics," he alleged.
Targeting the government's development narrative, the former Congress president claimed that "in the name of 'development,' an extortion racket is running," while policies are designed to benefit a select few.
"Modi ji's 'double engine' is running, but only for billionaires. For the common Indian, this double-engine



government of corruption is not development, but the speed of devastation," Gandhi said.
Gandhi also raised pointed questions about the handling of several high-profile crime cases, alleging political protection for the powerful. Referring to the murder of Ankita Bhandari in Uttarakhand, he said the case had "shaken the entire nation" but asked, "which BJP VIP is being protected by those in power? When will the law be equal for all?"
He drew parallels with the Un-ao rape case in Uttar Pradesh, saying the country had witnessed how "criminals were shielded by the arrogance of power" and how much the victim had to suffer to secure justice.
The Congress has repeatedly accused the BJP of misusing state machinery to protect influential individuals, a charge the ruling party has denied.

Himachal HC partly allows PIL on local body elections

Shimla: Himachal Pradesh High court has partly allowed a public interest litigation (PIL) seeking timely elections to Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) in the state, while granting major relief to the state government by permitting a deferment of the polls by about 90 days, despite the State Election Commission's stated readiness to conduct elections earlier.
Pronouncing the judgment, a Division Bench of Justice Vivek Singh Thakur and Justice Romesh Verma held that Panchayati Raj Institutions are constitutional bodies and their elections cannot be postponed indefinitely. At the same time, the court accepted the practical difficulties highlighting during the proceedings and directed that the election process be completed by April 30.

Nitesh Rane accuses Thackerays of favouring outsiders Warns Mumbai could be renamed

Nitesh Rane launched a sharp attack on Raj Thackeray and Uddhav Thackeray, questioning their contributions to the city despite being born in Mumbai.
Instead of developing the city, he alleged Rane and Thackerya had brought in Bangladeshis and Rohingyas into Mumbai.
"Did they achieve even a fraction of what Devendra Fadnavis has done for Mumbai's infrastructure and development over the years?" Rane asked rhetorically.
He also criticised Uddhav Thackeray, claiming he only managed to



turn "Matoshree 1 into Matoshree 2."
Rane alleged that the Thackerays wielded municipal power only for personal gains, meals, and tours outside the city.
"The real development of Mumbai has been done solely by Devendra Fadnavis. The Thackerays are just looters. Jihad Hrudaysamrat Uddhav Thackeray is nothing but a plunderer," Rane said.
He further warned voters, If Mumbaikars do not stay alert on the 15th, these people are ready to rename Mumbai ... They are prepared even to issue fatwas for this purpose.

NSG's NIDMS to be country's next-gen security shield against terrorism: Shah

Home Minister Amit Shah today inaugurated the National IED (Improvised Explosive Device) Data Management System (NIDMS) of the elite anti-terror force National Security Guard (NSG) in New Delhi through video conferencing on Friday.
Besides the home minister, the Home Secretary, Director of the Intelligence Bureau (IB), Director General of NSG, the Director Generals of other Central Armed Police Forces, and the Director Generals of Police of various states were present.
Speaking on the occasion, Shah said that inter-agency coordination on combatting terror will improve with the launch of the new system.
The Home Minister said that the system will become the next-generation security shield against terrorism, and it will be an effective way of delivering the right information at



the right time and in the right place.
The NIDMS is a secure national-level digital platform aimed at enabling the systematic collection, collation and dissemination of data related to Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs), Shah said.
He emphasised that now efforts

are underway to connect all of such data sources with one another, and to develop an advanced Artificial Intelligence-based software for their analysis.
With the launch of this system, Shah said that now a two-way comprehensive, integrated and online

Political parties in UP pull up their socks to enroll left over voters in SIR

Political parties have pulled up their socks to submit forms for enrolling left over voters in the Electoral rolls in Uttar Pradesh after 28.9 million voters names were deleted on the Special Intensive Revision (SIR).
According to the statistics in 2022 assembly polls in the state, there were 114 seats where the margin of victory was less than 10,000. Of these, 63 went to the BJP and 41 to the Samajwadi Party.
Looking at the results of the 2022 UP Assembly elections, there were 15 seats where the margin of victory or defeat was less than 1,000.
In 10 of these seats, the result was decided by a margin of less than 500 votes. Of these 15 seats, the BJP and

AAP disrupted MCD house, avoided discussion: Mayor

Delhi Mayor Raja Iqbal Singh on Friday accused the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) of repeatedly undermining the dignity of the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) House and deliberately disrupting its proceedings to avoid discussion on key public issues.
Addressing a press conference after the Corporation House meeting, the Mayor said a condemnation resolution against alleged insulting remarks made by AAP leader Atishi against Sikh Gurus was scheduled to be read out. He said the House was also to hold an important discussion on the long-pending issue of illegal parking in several parts of Delhi.
Mayor alleged that as soon as Leader of the House Pravesh Wahi began reading the condemnation resolution, AAP councillors created a ruckus, preventing the House from functioning normally. He said the disruption was planned to avoid accountability over the remarks made against Sikh Gurus.
Leader of the House Pravesh Wahi



said the MCD House passed a condemnation resolution against the insult to Sikh Gurus by Atishi, adding that any such insult would not be tolerated.
The Mayor further alleged that AAP deliberately blocked discussion on illegal parking as it has a direct nexus with parking mafias that flourished during its tenure. He claimed illegal parking networks were set up with political patronage and alleged this was the reason AAP did not want the issue to be discussed in the House.

Delhi CM sends off group of devotees for Ayodhya Dham

New Delhi: Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Friday sent off a group of devotees for Ayodhya Dham from the Chief Minister's Jan Seva Sadan. Around 35 to 40 devotees were part of this journey from Delhi to Ayodhya.

"All the devotees are extremely fortunate to receive the sacred opportunity of Lord Ram's darshan in the very first month of the New Year," Gupta said.
